Concrete Geometries

Concrete Geometries is a work-in-progress term derived from the synthesis of 'concrete', registering an existing reality or actual experience, and the abbreviation 'geometries', denoting spatial form.

Set up as a research cluster at the Architectural Association School of Architecture, Concrete Geometries investigates the intimate relationship between spatial form and human processes – be they social or aesthetic – and the variety of new material entities this relationship might provoke. To advance this research, the cluster launched an international call for submissions in January 2010. PREVIEW is the first in a series of events featuring selected work drawn from the wealth of 415 submissions received.
